Proposed Development of a 1MI Reservoir at the Bakubung Lodge, Pilanesberg National Park, North West Province

NuLeaf Planning and Environmental was appointed by Pilansberg Resorts (Pty) Ltd to conduct a Basic Assessment Process in support of an Environmental Authorisation for the proposed reservoir at the Bakubung Lodge, Pilansberg National Park, North West Province. A draft Basic Assessment Report (dBAR) was submitted in term of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the NEMA 2014 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The proposed development will include the construction of a 1 MI (1 000m³) potable water storage reservoir.

Francois Coetzee was appointed to conduct the heritage component of the dBAR.

No heritage resources were identified within the proposed development area.
