Proposed Granite mine development on Portion 1 & 4 of the Farm Nous West 76 in the Kai IGarib Local Municipality and Siyanda District Municipality of the Northern Cape

Green Direction Sustainability Consulting (Pty) Ltd was appointed by Sizisa Ukhanyo Trading 830 CC to conduct an Environmental Authorisation (EA) Application in support of a Mining Right Application for the proposed mining activities on portion of portion 1 and a portion of portion 4 of the farm Nous West 76 in the Magisterial District of Kenhardt, Northern Cape Province.

A draft Scoping Report has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, No 107 of 1998 (NEMA), and the 2017 NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, for activities that trigger the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, No 28 of 2002 (MPRDA)(As amended). The proposed activities include open cast mining of granite. Associated activities and infrastructure includes waste management facilities with site offices, on-site accommodations, laydown area, salvage yard, hazardous waste storage, generator bays, sorting and dressing area for the granite blocks, and granite waste dumps. A total of three quarries form part of this application with two already active as part of previous mining rights.

An existing SAHRIS application (Case ID 4310 – <http://sahra.org.za/sahris/cases/nc-30511210232-mp>) was created for a Mining Right Application on a property adjacent to this application and the HIA completed for that case is referenced as part of the Heritage Component of the current EA process. SAHRIS Case ID 11721 (<http://sahra.org.za/sahris/cases/granite-quarries-farms-zwart-modder-oup-and-nous-wes>) also has reference to this case.

The Archaeology Contracts Office (ACO) was appointed to conduct the heritage component of the current EA process.

A total of 13 heritage resources were identified within the proposed development area. These include seven Stone Age lithics and Khoi pottery surface occurrences that were deemed Not Conservation Worthy, five sites containing Stone Age lithics and stone walled structures of Low Local Significance including two rock shelters, and a possible grave of High Local Significance.

Recommendations provided in the report include the following:

- The stone walled kraal (D011) should be excluded from the quarrying,
- If the areas examined should change or new areas be added, they must be assessed for heritage resources.

Bamford, M. 2017. RE: Palaeontological Impact Assessment for proposed quarries, Northern Cape Province.

The development area includes granite rocks of the Little Namaqualand suite, Eeendoorn Granite and Hoogoor Suite. These rocks are entirely unfossiliferous. The development will not impact on fossil heritage and no further palaeontological impact assessment is required.

In an Interim Comment issued on the 22/01/2018, SAHRA requested that the draft EIA report and appendices be submitted before further comments could be issued.

The draft EIA and appendices have since been submitted.

Final Comment

The SAHRA Archaeological, Palaeontological and Meteorites (APM) Unit has no objection to the development and supports the recommendations of the specialists. The recommendations of the specialists and the following conditions apply to the development and must be included in the Environmental Management Programme:

- The stone kraal should be avoided with a 30 m buffer. A Heritage Management Plan (HMP) must be developed to manage development activities around this site;
- Should it not be possible to avoid the site, a permit in terms of section 35 of the NHRA and Chapter II and IV of the NHRA Regulations must be applied for;
- The Final EIA and EMP must be submitted for record purposes;
- If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g. remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, charcoal and ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed development, SAHRA APM

Unit (Natasha Higgitt/Phillip Hine 021 462 5402) must be alerted. If unmarked human burials are uncovered, the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG) Unit (Thingahangwi Tshivhase/Mimi Seetelo 012 320 8490), must be alerted immediately. A professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the findings. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required subject to permits issued by SAHRA.

- Should the project be granted Environmental Authorisation and Mining Right, SAHRA must be notified and all relevant documents submitted to the case file.
