BLACK ROCK MINING OPERATIONS PROPOSES TO ESTABLISH A NEW SUPER FINES STORAGE FACILITY AT GLORIA MINE TO ENABLE ADEQUATE STORAGE CAPACITY AS A RESULT OF PREVIOUS AUTHORISATIONS RELATING TO INCREASED PRODUCTION TAKING PLACE AT THE GLORIA MINE, ASSMANG (PTY) LTD BLACK ROCK MINE OPERATIONS, SANTOY, NORTHERN CAPE

EScience Associates (Pty) Ltd has been appointed by Assmang (Pty) Ltd Black Rock Mine Operation to conduct an Environmental Authorisation (EA) for the establishment of a Super Fines Storage Facility at Gloria Mine near Santoy, Northern Cape Province (NC 30/5/1/2/2/ (203)).

A draft Scoping report (DSR) has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 107 of 1998 (NEMA) and the NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations for activities that trigger the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, No 28 of 2002 (MPRDA)(As amended). The DSR notes that a heritage specialist report and palaeontological desktop study will be conducted during the EIA phase of the project.

In an Interim Comment issued on the 23/08/2019, SAHRA noted the pending heritage reports. Since the issuing of the Interim Comment, the draft EIA and heritage reports have been submitted for review (11/05/2020).

Banzai Environmental and Archaetnos Culture and Cultural Resource Consultants were appointed to provide heritage specialist input as required by section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA and in terms of section 38(8) and 38(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, act 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

The proposed development area is underlain by underlying Griqualand West Basin rocks of the Transvaal Supergroup. Stromatolites are known to be present within these rocks. The Cenozoic Kalahari Group sediments overlie Griqualand West rocks, which do not contain diverse fossil resources. The impact to palaeontological resources is considered to be low. A Chance Fossil Finds Procedure is recommended and is provided in the report.

Van Vollenhoven, A.C and Smit, J. 2019. A report on a Heritage Impact Assessment for the proposed New Tailings Facility at the Gloria Mine of the Assmang Black Rock Mining Operations (BRMO), Northern Cape Province.

No heritage resources were identified within the proposed development area. Stone Age lithics are known to be present in the surrounding area as shown in Figure 9 of the report. A Chance Finds Procedure is recommended.

Final Comment

- 38(4)c(ii) If unmarked human burials are uncovered, the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG)
 Unit (Thingahangwi Tshivhase/Mimi Seetelo 012 320 8490), must be alerted immediately as per
 section 36(6) of the NHRA. Non-compliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section
 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)d See section 51(1) of the NHRA;
