Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) intends to construct the powerline for the above-mentioned project. The powerline will include 6050 m MV and 14613 m LV powerlines which will be connected to the existing powerline in the area (refer to the Span plan sheets and the Pegging Coordinates for more information) Phalaborwa, Buffer Zone and Makushane camp, Maruleng local Municipality of the Limpopo Province. Environmental Screening of the powerline route was conducted during pegging of the route the by Survey team and site verification by Environmental Practitioner which lead to the generation of the servitude planning documents [Distribution Environmental Screening Document (DESD), Wayleave, Span plan and Pegging coordinates attached for your reference]. No Heritage resources outlined on item 6.3 of the DESD were observed on site.

Eskom SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) is requesting on behalf of their applicant, that SAHRA grant them an exemption from conducting heritage studies for this proposed power line development. According to the documents submitted to the case, the proposed new power line will be starting at CM and CMK 22 kV feeder, on the farm Makhushane 28 LU, in the Limpopo Province. The power line will be supplying electricity to Makhushane Camp and Bufferzone village near Phalaborwa.

The .kml file submitted to the case does not indicate the exact power line route, the mapped area must look exactly like the survey diagram, using points and lines only.

SAHRA Response to Notification of Development

This application constitutes a section 38 (1) application for approval by SAHRA in terms of the National Heritage Resources Act, no 25 of 1999 (NHRA), as the proposed power line exceeds 300 metres in length. As such SAHRA is providing response in terms of section 38(2) with regards to this application.

SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Unit cannot make an informed decision on this proposed

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development because the .kml file submitted to the case does not show the full extent of the power line route as indicated in the survey diagrams.

SAHRA requires a new .kml file to be submitted to the case on SAHRIS before the case is processed further.
