Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) intends to construct the powerline for the above-mentioned project. The powerline will be connected from the existing powerline in the area from pole number MBM47/26/89,

Eskom SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) is proposing to construct a new power line on behalf of their applicant in order to supply electricity to the applicants household in the Matsikaila village. According to the documents submitted to the case, the proposed new power line will be 461 metres starting at Malamulele/Boltman 22 kV feeder, on the farm Fischer 214 LT, in the Limpopo Province. The power line will be constructed along a gravel road servitude that passes by a cemetery.

SAHRA issued a Notification of Intent to Develop (NID) letter requesting a .kml file that maps the power line route as it appears on the span plan document, and a letter of exemption from undertaking a palaeontological assessment by a suitably qualified palaeontologist to determine whether the power line will not have an impact on palaeo-heritage.

Butler, E. December 2020. Palaeontological Desktop Assessment for the Electrification Project in the Matsakali Village, Limpopo.

The study area is underlain by Quaternary aged superficial deposits of moderate palaeontological significance. The proposed new power line will have a low negative impact and recommends no further mitigation measures.

If fossil remains or trace fossils are discovered during any phase of construction, either on the surface or exposed by excavations the Environmental Officer (EO) in charge of these developments must be informed. These discoveries ought to be protected and the ECO must report to SAHRA.

If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required at the expense of the developer. Mitigation will only be carried out after the archaeologist or palaeontologist obtains a permit in terms of section 35 of the NHRA (Act 25 of 1999).
