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Letter

In terms of Section 38(2) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

PROPOSED CONSENT USE APPLICATION IN RESPECT OF ERF 217, RIVERSIDE PARK EXTENSION 20 TOWNSHIP.

Thank you for submitting the above Consent Use application in respect of 217, Riverside Park, to SAHRA.

In terms of the National Heritage Resources Act, no 25 of 1999, heritage resources, including archaeological or palaeontological sites over 100 years old, graves older than 60 years and structures older than 60 years are protected. They may not be disturbed without a permit from the relevant heritage resources authority.

The application is for Consent Use to utilise the property for a brick distribution centre on an area currently zoned "Special Use". The land is currently occupied by a brick release establishment known as "Malelane Stene".

As such, the submitted application does not trigger Section 38 of the NHRA (Act 25 of 1999) as the proposed development does not constitute a change in character to the site, nor is the application for rezoning of a site exceeding 10 000m².

Consequently, SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology & Meteorites (APM) Unit has no objection to the granting of the consent use application on the condition that if any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g., remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, marine shell and charcoal/ash concentrations), unmarked human burials, fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed activities, SAHRA APM Unit (Jenna Lavin/Colette Scheermeyer 021 462 4502) must be alerted immediately, and a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contacted as soon as possible to inspect the findings. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation might be necessary.
