Joan Consulting (Pty) Ltd has been appointed by Pan African Minerals Development Company (Pty) Ltd to conduct an Environmental Authorisation (EA) Application for proposed prospecting activities on several farms in the Kuruman Magisterial District near Kuruman in the Northern Cape Province (NC30/5/1/1/2/12535 PR).

A Basic Assessment Report (BAR) dated November 2020 has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the 2017 EIA Regulations for activities that trigger the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (MPRDA)(As amended). The proposed prospecting right application area will cover 10 365 ha and will include 10 borehole sites (150m² each between 150 and 200m deep) with a site office and ablutions (2000m²), water sumps per borehole, workshop and storage yard.

Integrated Specialist Services (Pty) Ltd have been appointed to provide heritage specialist input into the EA process as per section 24(4)b(iii) of the NEMA and section 38(3) and section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

The report notes that structures were identified, however noted that the ages of the structures could not be confirmed. No other heritage resources were identified within the development area. The recommendations section on page 55 refers to a recorded burial site, however no descriptions are provided in the report.

Recommendations contained within the report include the following:

- The proposed prospecting right application may be allowed to proceed subject to monitoring by a professional archaeologist during prospecting
- Known burial sites must marked and protected during prospecting
- There is a possibility of encountering unknown burial sites, it is thus advised to seek information about burial sites from farmers and farm workers.
- It is also advised that the Archaeology, Palaeontology and SAHRA Meteorites Unit is alerted when site work begins.
- Strict and clear reporting procedures for chance findings must be followed by Pan African Mineral Development Company (Pty) Ltd and its contractors throughout the whole period of prospecting.

Interim Comment

The SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Unit cannot accept the submitted HIA as various information requirements are not present or ill-defined.

Section 38(3)a of the NHRA requires that the identified heritage resources be mapped in the area affected. This must include the tracklogs of the survey completed as per the SAHRA 2007 Minimum Standards: Archaeological and Palaeontological Components of Impact Assessments. Additionally, no details on the structures are provided.

Therefore, the SAHRA APM Unit requests that a revised HIA be conducted and submitted for comments as part of the EA process. Additionally, as the prospecting rights application area is located in an area of moderate and very high sensitivity for palaeontological resources as per the SAHRIS PalaeoSensitivity map, a field-based Palaeontological Impact Assessment (PIA) must be required to be undertaken by a qualified palaeontologist. The report must comply with the 2012 Minimum Standards: Palaeontological Components of Heritage Impact Assessments.

The applicant is advised to extend the EA process in terms of section 19(1)b of the NEMA EIA regulations in order to comply with this comment.
