Final Decision

In terms of Section 38(2) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) intends to construct the power line for the above-mentioned project. The power line will include MV which will be connected to the existing power line in the area (refer to the Span plan sheets and the Pegging Coordinates for more information) Lemondokop village, Greater Letaba local Municipality of the Limpopo Province.

Eskom SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) is proposing to construct a new power line on behalf of their applicant, to supplying electricity to a household in the Lomondokop Village. According to the documents submitted to the case, the proposed new power line will be starting at Keerom 22 kV feeder constructed along existing gravel road servitudes on the farm Lomondokop 184 LT. This application is similar to case 16535 but in a different location.

The photos provided to the case do not show any surface heritage features therefore, the potential impact on heritage resources is considered low. The construction of a 22 kV power line that is less than a kilometre in length will not change the character of the landscape. The likelihood of heritage artefacts being uncovered from the foundation excavations is low. However, the area is relatively undisturbed, and any construction close to the dry stream bed must be monitored by the construction manager.

Final Decision

SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Unit grants this application an exemption from further heritage assessments in terms of section 38(2)b of the National Heritage Resources Act, no 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

SAHRA has no objections to this proposed development going ahead and this Final Decision applies to the provisions of the NHRA only.
