# A Phase 1 AIA / HIA for bulk water infrastructure (Dams & Weirs) on the farm Nosilla 27JU, White River / Hazyview area, Mpumalanga

The applicant has appointed Rengu Environmental Services (Pty) Ltd to undertake a Basic Assessment application process in support for an Environmental Authorisation (EA) in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, Act no 107 of 1998 (NEMA) as amended, for activities that trigger the NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) 2014 Regulations, as amended.

The applicant is proposing to clear existing blue gum tree plantation to make way for macadamia orchards, and the construction of 2 weirs and pump stations, 3 dams, 2 water pipelines, and electrical infrastructure which require authorisation for bulk water infrastructure. The proposed macadamia orchards are located on the farm Nosilla 27 JU in the Mbombela Local Municipality of the Mpumalanga Province. The total development area will be 218 ha.

The development area is located in an area of negligible palaeontological sensitivity/grey zone on the palaeomap and according to the palaeomap, the proposed development is exempt from undertaking a Palaeontological Impact Assessment (PIA) assessment. A Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) report by Adonsonia Heritage (Pty) Ltd has been submitted to SAHRA for commenting in terms of section 38 of the National Heritage Resources Act, no. 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

The author undertook a field survey of the proposed development area and did not identify any heritage

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resources, and the farm manager is not aware of any heritage on the property. The current property has been altered by blue gum tree forestry activities making the likelihood of finding surface heritage very low. The author recommends chance finds procedures in the event that subsurface heritage artefacts are uncovered during excavation work.

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### **Final Comment**

The SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) accepts the HIA report. The SAHRA has no objection to the development going ahead on the following conditions:

In the unlikely event that fossils are uncovered during construction then construction must cease within the immediate vicinity, a buffer of 30 m must be established, and a palaeontologist called in to inspect the finds. The palaeontologist must obtain a section 35(4) permit in terms of NHRA and Chapter IV NHRA Regulations, before any fossils are collected.

If there are any new heritages resources are discovered during construction and operation phases of the proposed development, then a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the findings at the expense of the developer.

If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required at the expense of the developer. Mitigation will only be carried out after the archaeologist or palaeontologist obtains a permit in terms of section 35 of the NHRA (Act 25 of 1999). If any unmarked human burials are uncovered and the archaeologist called in to inspect the finds and/or the police find them to be heritage graves, then mitigation may be necessary and the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG) Unit must be contacted for processes to follow (Thingahangwi Tshivhase/Ngqalabutho Madida 012 320 8490).

The Final BAR and its appendices must be submitted to the case and once a Record of Decision from the competent authority is issued, it must also be submitted to the case.
