Proposed prospecting activities on Portion 1, a portion of Portion 8 and Portion 19 of the farm Sacha 468, situated in the Magisterial District of Kuruman, Northern Cape Province.

Lindie Wiehahn Consultants have been appointed by Future Gems (Pty) Ltd to undertake an Environmental Authorisation Application for proposed prospecting activities on Portion 1, a portion of Portion 8 and Portion 19 of the farm Sacha 468, situated in the Magisterial District of Kuruman, Northern Cape Province (NC 30/5/1/1/2/12995 PR).

A Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR) has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the EIA Regulations for activities that trigger the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (MPRDA)(As amended). The report must comply with the 2012 Minimum Standards: Palaeontological Components of Heritage Impact Assessments.

Any other heritage resources as defined in section 3 of the NHRA that may be impacted, such as built structures over 60 years old, sites of cultural significance associated with oral histories, burial grounds and graves, graves of victims of conflict, and cultural landscapes or viewscapes must also be assessed.

The applicant is advised to extend the EA process in terms of section 19(1)b of the NEMA EIA Regulations in order to comply with this comment. A revised BAR with the results of the above requested specialist studies must be completed.
