New eskom line to Vodacom tower

Eskom has submitted an application in terms of section 38(1) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA) for a proposed construction of a 11kV powerline for a new Vodacom Tower on the farm Zwelisha 88 JU, in Phakane Village, Mpumalanga Province.

The proposed powerline will be located along existing roads. The proposed development is located in an area of insignificant palaeontological sensitivity as per the SAHRIS PalaeoSensitivity map.

Final Decision

As the proposed line will be located in a disturbed area, is unlikely that in-situ heritage resources will be impacted by the proposed powerline. As such, no further assessment of the impact to heritage resources is required as per section 38(2)a of the NHRA.

The applicant is advised of the following:

- If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g. remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, charcoal and ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed development, SAHRA (Natasha Higgitt 021 202 8660) must be alerted as per section 35(3) of the NHRA.
