## **Final Comment**

In terms of Section 38(4), 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Attention: KAI !GARIB LOCAL MUNICIPALITY

Proposed construction of an abstraction works and pipeline from the Orange River to the Plangeni Settlement near Keimoes, Northern Cape. The bulk water pipeline will be 160mm in diameter and approximately 2km in length.

MDA Town & Regional Planners, Environmental & Development Consultants have been appointed by Kai !Garib Local Municipality to undertake an Environmental Authorisation Application for the proposed water pipeline and abstraction works from the Orange River to the Plangeni Settlement near Keimoes,

A Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR) has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The proposed activities will include an abstraction pipeline along the river banks, concrete platform and pump with below ground water pipeline (2 km in length) and a purification plant to the Plangeni Development.

Palaeo Field Services were appointed to provide heritage specialist input as part of the EA process as per section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA and section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

Roussuw, L. 2023. Phase 1 Heritage Impact Assessment for the proposed construction of a 1.7km long freshwater pipeline from the Orange River to Plangeni, Northern Cape Province

The proposed development area is underlain by the Keimoes Suite that is insignificant in terms of sensitivity for palaeontological resources, granites and moderately significant alluvial overburden. No fossils were identified during the site visit. One low density scatter of Stone Age lithics of low heritage significance was identified within the proposed pipeline route. No further recommendations were provided.

#### **Final Comment**

Non-compliance with this section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)c(ii) If unmarked human burials are uncovered, the SAHRA DAU (Natasha Higgitt 021 202 8660/ <a href="mailto:nhiggitt@sahra.org.za">nhiggitt@sahra.org.za</a>) must be alerted immediately as per section 36(6) of the NHRA. Non-compliance with this section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)d See section 51(1) of the NHRA regarding offences;
- 38(4)e The following conditions apply with regards to the appointment of specialists:
- i) If heritage resources are uncovered during the course of the development, a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the heritage resource. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required subject to permits issued by SAHRA;
- The Final BAR must be submitted to the SAHRIS application for record purposes;
- The decision regarding the EA application must be submitted to the SAHRIS application for record purposes.
