The above report was submitted for the proposed upgrading and refurbishment of the existing bulk storage infrastructure that forms part of the greater Carolina Water Supply Scheme. Please note that, should SAHRA have been informed of the proposed development at the BID stage, and based on the proposed development and its location, it is unlikely that further heritage studies would have been requested and as such, the above report is considered as a request for exemption from conducting further studies.

The above report assessed both the Water Purification Works as well as the Main Water Storage Facilities. Both of these sites have been substantially altered by construction activities in the past. As such, it is unlikely that the proposed development will have an impact on significant heritage resources.

No heritage resources were identified in the report.

Final Comment:

SAHRA has no objection to the proposed development and no further heritage studies are required.

Should any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g., remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, charcoal/ash concentrations), unmarked human burials, fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed activities, SAHRA APM Unit (Jenna Lavin/Colette Scheermeyer 021 462 4502) must be alerted immediately, and a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contacted as soon as possible to inspect the findings.
