### PROPOSED TOWNSHIP ESTABLISHMENT ON A CERTAIN PORTION OF PORTIO R/26 FARM TWEEFONTEIN 372-JR: PROPOSED BRONBERG EXTENSION 26

Thank you for the indication that development is to take place in this area.

In the application submitted to SAHRA it is proposed that the area, approximately 1,5 hectares in extent is earmarked for township development. The property is zoned undetermined, but houses three dwellings with associated outbuildings, garages and a carports. The property is not pristine and is surrounded by well developed suburbs.

Considering these factors it is highly unlikely that heritage resources would be impacted by the proposed development, consequently SAHRA has no objection to the proposed development in terms of the archaeological and palaeontological component of the heritage resources. If archaeological/palaeontological or any other types of heritage resources are found during construction activities, SAHRA (Colette Scheermeyer/Phillip Hine, tel. 021 462 4502) and an archaeologist or palaeontologist depending on the nature of the find, must be alerted immediately. If the newly discovered heritage resource is considered significant, a rescue excavation may be required and a permit from the responsible heritage authority would be required.
