

Thank you for informing SAHRA of the proposed power line construction in the Belfast area. The power line will be located on Portion 12 and 13 of the farm Groenvlei 353 JT, Highlands Local Municipality, in Mpumalanga Province. The total length of the power line will be 766 m. The power line is intended to start at the Machadadorp 22kV rural feeder.

It should be noted that this proposed development constitutes a linear development exceeding 300m as per Section 38(1) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999). In terms of Section 38(2) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999), the relevant heritage authority is required to determine whether or not the proposed development is likely to impact on any significant heritage resources.

Based on the submitted information to this case, the power line route is proposed to be constructed across a river and gravel road, in agricultural farming area. The possibility of finding significant heritage resources in the power line servitude is low.

Final Decision

Due to the low ground clearing and disturbance of a 22kV power line construction and/or development, it is unlikely that any significant heritage will be disturbed during construction in the area of proposed power line route, as such no further heritage studies are required as per Section 38(2)b. However since there is little present development, construction must be vigilant of any possible heritage resources.

SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology & Meteorites (APM) Unit has no objection to the proposed development on the condition that:

- If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g., remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments and charcoal/ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed activities, a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contacted as soon as possible to inspect the findings.
- If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance a Phase 2 rescue operation might be necessary, and a permit will be needed before mitigation. 
