Final Comment

In terms of Section 38(4), 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Attention: Lutzburg solar (RF) (Pty) Ltd

Solar Power Plant Development: The remaining extent of portion 2 of the farm Ruby Vale No. 266, registration division Gordonia, Tsantsabane Local Municipality, Northern Cape Province

Environamics has been appointed by Lutzburg Solar (RF) (Pty) Ltd to conduct an Environmental Authorisation (EA) Amendment Application process for the authorised Lutzburg Photovoltaic (PV) Solar Power Plant, near Postmasburg, Northern Cape Province (DEA Ref: 14/12/16/3/3/2/938).

A draft Motivation Report has been submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, no 107 of 1998 (NEMA) and the NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The proposed amendment will include the installation of a battery energy storage system (BESS) within the authorised footprint covering approximately 2 ha, increasing the capacity of the facility and height of the panels and number of invertors, the amendment of the location of the access road and powerline, increasing the substation footprint and amending the layout of the invertors, buildings and internal roads. The new route for the powerline and access road has been assessed as part of the Lutzburg (https://sahris.sahra.org.za/cases/lutzburg-solar-rf-pty-ltd), Tirisano (https://sahris.sahra.org.za/cases/tirisano-pv-solar-power-project) and Kgalalelo Solar Power Plants (https://sahris.sahra.org.za/cases/hia-proposed-kgalalelo-pv-solar-power-project).

In a previous comment issued on the 01/09/2016, SAHRA noted no objections to the development and provided conditions (https://sahris.sahra.org.za/node/368633).

Dr van Schalkwyk has been appointed to provide heritage specialist input as part of the EA Amendment application report as required by section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA and section 38(3) and 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA).

The specialist confirmed that the proposed amendments will not result in any additional impacts on heritage resources. The previously provided mitigation and management measures are still valid.

Final Comment

The following comments are made as a requirement in terms of section 3(4) of the NEMA Regulations and section 38(8) of the NHRA in the format provided in section 38(4) of the NHRA and must be included in the Final Motivation Report and EMPr:

- 38(4)a The SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Unit has no objections to the proposed amendment to the authorised development;
- 38(4)b The recommendations of the specialists are supported and must be adhered to. Further additional specific conditions are provided for the development as follows;
- The conditions contained within the Final Comment issued on the 01/09/2016 are valid and must be adhered to:
- The Final Comments issued for the Lutzburg, Tirisano and Kgalalelo cases as noted above are valid for the powerline and access roads and must be adhered to;
- 38(4)c(i) If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g. remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, charcoal and ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed development, SAHRA APM Unit (Natasha Higgitt/Phillip Hine 021 462 5402) must be alerted as per section 35(3) of the NHRA. Non-compliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)c(ii) If unmarked human burials are uncovered, the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG) Unit (Thingahangwi Tshivhase/Mimi Seetelo 012 320 8490), must be alerted immediately as per section 36(6) of the NHRA. Non-compliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)d See section 51(1) of the NHRA;
- 38(4)e The following conditions apply with regards to the appointment of specialists:
- i) If heritage resources are uncovered during the course of the development, a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the heritage resource. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required subject to permits issued by SAHRA;
- The Final Motivation Report and EMPr must be submitted to SAHRA for record purposes;
