Final Decision

In terms of Section 38(2), 38(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) hereby notifying you that it intends to electrify Bellville Lorraine village, The MV and LV lines are more than 300m in size which will T-off from the existing powerline in pole number MTR223/28 refer to the Span plan sheets and the Pegging Coordinates for more information). The project is located in the Greater Tzaneen Local Municipality of Mopani District Municipality of the Limpopo Province.

Eskom SOC Ltd, Limpopo Operating Unit (LOU) is requesting, on behalf of their applicant, that SAHRA grant them an exemption from conducting heritage studies for this proposed power line development. According to the documents submitted to the case, the proposed MV and LV lines are more than 300m and will be erected for the electrification of Bellville Lorraine village in the Greater Tzaneen Local Municipality of Mopani District Municipality of the Limpopo Province.

The proposed development is located in an area of insignificant palaeontological sensitivity as per the SAHRIS PalaeoSensitivity map. It is noted that the photos provided do not show any surface heritage features and potential impact on heritage resources is considered low.

Final Decision

The SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Unit notes that the level of disturbance at the proposed development area is not extensive, and assumes that no significant archaeological heritage resources would be impacted by the construction of the 22kV powerlines. Therefore, in terms of section 38(2)b of the National Heritage Resources Act, no 25 of 1999 (NHRA), the proposed development is granted an exemption from undertaking a Heritage Impact Assessment.

SAHRA has no objections to this proposed development going ahead and this Final Comment applies to the provisions of the NHRA only.

The following conditions still apply and need to be added to Appendix C 1.22:

If there are any new heritage resources discovered during construction and operation phases of the proposed development, then a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the findings at the expense of the developer.

If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required at the expense of the developer. Mitigation will only be carried out after the archaeologist or palaeontologist obtains a permit in terms of section 35 of the NHRA (Act 25 of 1999). If any unmarked human burials are uncovered and the archaeologist called in to inspect the finds and/or the police find them to be heritage graves, then mitigation may be necessary and the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG) Unit must be contacted for processes to follow (Mimi Seetelo 072 802 1251).
