



Final Comment

In terms of Section 38 of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999) and the KwaZulu-Natal Heritage Act (Act 4 of 2008)

PROPOSED CHARLESTOWN HOUSING DEVELOPMENT, KWAZULU-NATAL, SOUTH AFRICA. PROJECT NO: K12020009.

We acknowledge receipt of the Charlestown Housing development application and note that the HIA survey identified and recommended that :

- Sites CHST-1 and CHST-3 should be fenced off from the rest of construction activities and a cemetery management plan should be developed to manage these sites during and post the construction phase of the project.
- Site CHST-2 should be relocated to a municipal proclaimed/declared cemetery to avoid any potential impacts to the site prior to the commencement of project construction phase. A permit should be applied for with Amafa aKwaZuluNatali before this process can be undertaken by an accredited and qualified archaeologist and heritage consultant.

The object of Amafa is to administer, conserve and protect heritage resources of the Province within the terms of KZN Heritage Act no. 4 (2008) and the National Heritage Resources Act No 25 of 1999. We therefore accept the proposed recommendations and mitigation procedures regarding the identified heritage resources.

As such, in terms of the KwaZulu Natal Heritage Act No. 4 of 2008 and the National Heritage Resources Act No. 25 of 1999 (Section 38 (1)), considering the findings outlined in the HIA Report by Nkosinathi Thomose for the Charlestown Housing development, we have no objection to the proposed development within limits of the prescribed mitigation measures and recommendations.

You are also required to adhere to the below-mentioned standard conditions:

Conditions:

1. Amafa should be contacted if any heritage objects are identified during earthmoving activities and all development should cease until further notice.
2. No structures older than sixty years or parts thereof are allowed to be demolished altered or extended without a permit from Amafa.
3. No activities are allowed within 50m of a site, which contains rock art.
4. Amafa should be contacted if any graves are identified during construction and the following procedure
