In terms of Section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999) and the KwaZulu-Natal Heritage Act (Act 4 of 2008)

Mining permit application and Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for mining of weathered sandstone near Fawn Lease, kwazulu-Natal.

Thank you for the invitation to comment on this development. We have reviewed the attached documents and note that the development is not likely to impact on significant paleontologically sensitive areas in terms of version 2 of the fossil sensitivity map (<http://www.sahra.org.za/map/palaeo>). The development is however likely to impact on Historical, Iron Age and Stone Age sites and features. In terms of the heritage legislation in South Africa, such sites or features may not be disturbed without a permit from the relevant heritage resources authority.

This means that before such sites are disturbed by development it is incumbent on the developer to ensure that a Heritage Impact Assessment is done. This must include the archaeological component (Phase 1) and any other applicable heritage components. Appropriate (Phase 2) mitigation, which involves recording, sampling and dating sites that are to be destroyed, must be done as required.
