Application for permits rectifying the unlawful collection and export of material related to site DUB004 - Phase 2 archaeological mitigation on site DUB004 for the Agrizone Phase 2 Development at the Dube Trade Port, King Shaka International Airport, Tongaat, KwaZulu Natal Province

The Heritage Officers Committee Meeting considered your application on 20 July 2022. The Committee condemns the unauthorized export of archaeological objects from the province in which the Institute is the custodian on behalf of the Provincial Government in terms of Section 40(6)(a) of the KwaZulu-Natal Amafa and Research Institute Act 05 of 2018.

However, the committee resolved to condone this unauthorized work on the basis that the archaeological material exported will be returned as indicated and the results of lab studies conducted are submitted to the Institute.

Failure to comply with the requirements of the National Heritage Resources Act and the KwaZulu-Natal Amafa and Research Institute Act could lead to legal action being constituted against the applicant.
