Final Comment

In terms of Section 38(4), 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Attention: Nala Local Municipality

Development of a township establishment, which includes formalization of the existing informal settlement located on Portion of the Farm Oranjevlei 174, Wesselsbron within the jurisdiction of Nala Local Municipality.

NSVT Consultants has been appointed by Vexocom (Pty) Ltd to undertake the Environmental Authorisation application for the rectification and continuation process which includes the formalisation of the Khalinkomo Informal Settlement located on Portion of the Farm Oranjevlei 174, Wesselsbron within the jurisdiction of Nala Local Municipality, Free State Province.

A draft Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) report was submitted in terms of the section 24G (1) of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (as amended) ("NEMA"). The clearance of approximately 20.5 hectares of indigenous vegetation and construction of latrines and internal roads along with temporary communal water standpipes was done before an EA was obtained.

The total development footprint for the proposed Khalinkomo township establishment is 102.59 hectares and 1476 residential units will be constructed. The proposed development includes grading of internal roads along with excavations for laying of sewer and water pipelines.

Pelser, A.J. 2020. Phase 1 HIA Report For The Proposed Khalinkomo Township Development Located On A Portion Of Oranjevlei 174 In Wesselsbron/Monyakeng, Free State Province

No sites, features or material of cultural heritage (archaeological and/or historical) origin or significance were identified in the study area. The area has been disturbed by earlier farming activities and recent informal and more formal residential settlement. It is recommended that the development be allowed to continue.

The SAHRA APM unit issued an interim comment dated 19/01/2021 which requested that a desktop PIA be undertaken and submitted to the case. The comment also requested that the submitted HIA be amended to include the tracklog of the field survey of the study area. The HIA was subsequently amended and submitted to the case along with the requested PIA on the 08/02/2021.

Butler, E. 2021. Palaeontological Desktop Assessment for the proposed Khalinkomo Township Development Located on a Portion Oranjevlei 174 in Wesselsbron/Monyakeng, in the Free State

The study area is underlain by the Volksrust Formation (Ecca Group, Karoo Supergroup) as well as Quaternary aeolian sand.

Quaternary deposits fossil assemblages include bivalves, diatoms, gastropod shells, ostracods along with bones, horn corns as well as mammalian teeth. Tortoise remains have also been uncovered as well as amphibian and crocodile remains. Fossil assemblages of the Volksrust Formation include rare temnospondyl amphibian remains, invertebrates, petrified wood, and low-diversity marine to non-marine trace fossil assemblages along with minor coals with plant remains and bivalve Megadesmus.

It is recommended that the proposed development will not lead to detrimental impacts on the palaeontological reserves of the area and development may be authorised. A Chance Find Protocol is attached to the report.

The SAHRA issued an interim comment dated 17/02/2021 which rejected the PIA on the basis of it being contradictory and lacking logical conclusions. A revised field based PIA was subsequently submitted to the case on the 23/02/2021.

Butler, E. 2021. Palaeontological Field Assessment for the proposed Khalinkomo Township Development in Wesselsbron/Monyakeng, in the Free State

A field survey was conducted and the area was found to be covered by lush grassy vegetation with flat topography. No rocky ridges or fossiliferous outcrops are present in the area, therefore an overall medium palaeontological significance is allocated to the development footprint. It is consequently recommended that no further palaeontological heritage studies, ground truthing and/or specialist mitigation are required pending the discovery of newly discovered fossils. A Chance Find Protocol is attached to the report.
