Proposed Construction of Gugulethu Piggery for 600 saws on Farm no. 17601 Oliviershoek, Bergville, Okhahlamba Local Municipality, Uthukela District Municipality, KwaZulu-Natal. The Piggery shall house 600 sows in 3 separate sheds namely Furrowing and Weaner house, Gestation house and Grower house, at Gugulethu rural area. The Piggery shall consist of Piggery Houses, 60 cu.m fresh water storage in Jojo tanks, 40 cu.m of waste water temporal storage Jojo tanks.

The Heritage Impact Assessment by the heritage specialist ,Frans Prins and the recommendations therein have been considered . The report indicates that various grave sites were observed during the ground survey but none occur closer than 30m to the proposed development site. The development is not considered to be a threat to any known heritage resources as none were observed in the development footprint and its immediate surroundings.

For this reason Amafa has no objection to the development provided the developer operates within the confines of the stipulated recommendations and protocol provided.

You are also required to adhere to the below-mentioned standard conditions:

Conditions:

- 1. Amafa should be contacted if any heritage objects are identified during earthmoving activities and all development should cease until further notice.

- 4. Sources of all natural materials (including topsoil, sands, natural gravels, crushed stone, asphalt, etc.) must be obtained in a sustainable manner and in compliance with the heritage legislation. Failure to comply with the requirements of the National Heritage Resources Act and the KwaZulu Natal Heritage Resources Act could lead to legal action being instituted against the applicant.
