- 1. The Heritage Officers' Committee meeting considered your application on 9 October 2023.

 - b) an assessment of the significance of such resources in terms of the heritage assessment criteria set out in section 6(2) or prescribed under section 7;
 - c) an assessment of the impact of the development on such heritage resources;
 - d) an evaluation of the impact of the development on heritage resources relative to the sustainable social and economic benefits to be derived from the development;
 - e) the results of consultation with communities affected by the proposed development and other interested parties regarding the impact of the development on heritage resources:
 - f) if heritage resources will be adversely affected by the proposed development, the consideration of alternatives; and
