### PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF KAMBAKU PRIVATE SCHOOL ON PORTION 7 OF THE FARM VLAKPLAATS 137 KQ .

*Hutten, M. February 2012. Heritage Impact Assessment for the proposed development of the Kambaku Private School on the farm Vlakplaats 137 KQ, approximately 15km north of Thabazimbi, Limpopo Province.*

The development of a private school is proposed on the farm Vlakplaats 137 KQ, approximately 15 km north of Thabazimbi, Limpopo Province. The proposed development will have a footprint of 20 hectares. According to the specialist the area is not in pristine condition and has been disturbed by past agricultural activities. No archaeological of any other types of heritage resources were identified during the field survey.

Since no archaeological resources were identified during the field assessment, SAHRA APM Unit has no objection to the proposed development in terms of the archaeological component of the heritage resources. Since no assessment of palaeontological resources has been submitted, such a study must be undertaken before the commencement of development, or at least a letter of exemption from further palaeontological studies must be compiled by a professional palaeontologist and submitted to SAHRA.

If any new evidence of archaeological sites or artefacts, palaeontological fossils, graves or other heritage resources are found during development, construction or mining, SAHRA (Mr Phillip Hine/Mrs Colette Scheermeyer) and a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist according to the finding, must be alerted immediately.

Decisions on Built Environment (e.g. structures over 60 years) and Cultural Landscapes and associated Living Heritage (e.g. sacred sites) must be made by Provincial Heritage Resources Authority (Mr Donald Lithole, [litholek@sac.lp.gov.za](mailto:litholek@sac.lp.gov.za).) to whom this document will be copied.
