We propose to sample fossil tooth and bone to recover ancient DNA from five Late Pleistocene Caprin specimens from Boomplaas Cave in South Africa. The application of ancient DNA sequencing techniques will allow us to better understand the taxonomic identity of a poorly understood extinct species known only from South Africa and to reconstruct its demographic history through time, allowing us to shed light on the potential environmental and human factors that contributed to its extinction in the early Holocene.
