### 15MW PV development , Logagane, North West Province

*Fourie, W. Heritage Scoping Assessment Proposed 10 Mw Solar Photovoltaic Farm, Molopo 307 JO, Logagane, Northwest Province.*

Maiteko Energy Investment (Pty) Ltd proposes the establishment of a 10Mw solar facility on the farm Molopo 307 JO, west of the town of Logagane, North West Province. A Heritage Scoping report was undertaken for this particular project, inclusive of a field survey which was conducted over one day. No background information about the site was included in the report. No indication of the proposed infrastructure or earthworks anticipated for the proposed development was provided in any detail.

No assessment of the impacts of the proposed development to palaeontological resources has been completed for this proposed development.

#### **Comment:**

SAHRA requires that a revised HIA be submitted that includes the following;

- A background study that includes a literature review
- A detailed description of the proposed work and infrastructure anticipated for the site
- A desktop palaeontological assessment or alternatively, a letter of exemption from a palaeontologist
- An assessment of impacts to other kinds of heritage resources such as the built environment, landscapes and intangible heritage

SAHRA looks forward to receiving this revised HIA before commenting further.
