MCM Mining obtained environmental and heritage authorizations to extract coal on the farms Daru 889MS and Tanga 648 MS. Known as the Makhado Colliery, this project is situated north of Makhado Town, on the foothills of the Soutpansberg range of mountains along the R525 road which goes to the Nzhelele Dam. Topographically, the site of the Makhado Colliery is characterised by calcrete outcrops, sandstone ridges and floodplains of the Mutamba River. Before exploration by MCM Mining, these farms were previously used for agriculture and cattle keeping before being converted into game farming. As part of the environmental authorization process, a heritage study was performed in 2012 (Roodt 2012) and identified several archaeological sites and three burials in an area where the West Pit of the Makhado Colliery will be located.
