The uMgungundlovu Municipality propose to construct the New Hanover Secondary Bulk Water Pipeline and Reservoir as part of Phase 2 of the uMshwathi Bulk Water Scheme. The project involves the construction of a 7.6km x 160mm diameter bulk water pipeline and a 0.5Ml concrete reservoir. The pipeline is located to the south of New Hanover town and east of Trust Feed within Ward 9 of the uMshwathi Local Municipality, KZN.

Thank you for informing Amafa Heritage KwaZulu Natal about this development . This office has assessed the application and established that the survey conducted by Frans Prins did not find any heritage resources or features in and around the proposed development footprint to warrant further mitigation measures.

Amafa therefore has no objection to the development.

You are however required to adhere to the below-mentioned standard conditions:

Conditions:

- 1. Amafa should be contacted if any heritage objects are identified during earthmoving activities and all development should cease until further notice.
- 2. No structures older than sixty years or parts thereof are allowed to be demolished altered or extended without a permit from Amafa.
- 3. No activities are allowed within 50m of a site, which contains rock art.
- 4. Sources of all natural materials (including topsoil, sands, natural gravels, crushed stone, asphalt, etc.) must be obtained in a sustainable manner and in compliance with the heritage legislation.

Failure to comply with the requirements of the National Heritage Resources Act and the KwaZulu Natal Heritage Resources Act could lead to legal action being instituted against the applicant.

This decision is valid for a period of two years.
