In terms of Section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999) and the KwaZulu-Natal Heritage Act (Act 4 of 2008)

We acknowledge receipt of the invitation to comment on the Heritage Impact Assessment Report by Gavin Anderson incorporating a palaeontological component by Gideon Groenewald. We note that the development will not impact on any archaeological features but quarrying activities on Quarry 1 are likely to impact on fossil deposits. Amafa therefore has no objection to the development subject to the following conditions:

1. A palaeontologist is on site during quarrying activities on Quarry 1.
2. The construction team is provided an induction that prohibits activities that may impact on possible archaeological features that are outside the road servitude (e.g. cairns within the HIA report).

You are also required to adhere to the below-mentioned standard conditions:

Conditions:

1. Amafa should be contacted if any heritage objects are identified during earthmoving activities and all development should cease until further notice.
2. No structures older than sixty years or parts thereof are allowed to be demolished altered or extended without a permit from Amafa.
3. No activities are allowed within 50m of a site, which contains rock art.
