The application is for Amafa input on the proposed raising of a an exiting dam wall in the Dundee Area. The Existing dam wall is 8 m high and is proposed to be lifted to 12.5 m high, the dam will cover an area of some 49 ha when full and be used for the irrigation of crops. It is situated on the Property Lerryn 8602 and Halifax 8603, some 5 km east of the town of Dundee, KZN. The current EIA no. is DC24/0028/2012.

We acknowledge receipt of the Heritage Report by Frans Prins of Active Heritage. Development may proceed as planned as the survey did not find any heritage resources within and in the vicinity of the development footprint.

You are however required to adhere to the below-mentioned standard conditions:

2. No structures older than sixty years or parts thereof are allowed to be demolished altered or extended without a permit from Amafa.
3. No activities are allowed within 50m of a site, which contains rock art.
