Proposes development to upgrade the existing Emadongeni mud track to a type 7A gravel road. The upgraded local road will be approximately 3.1km in length, 6 m width and 20 m road reserve which conforms to DOT standards for a local road upgrades. The upgrade will take place in the Kleinfontein area in Ladysmith under the Alfred Duma Local Municipality administered by the UThukela District Municipality in the KwaZulu-Natal Province.
