Thank you for submitting this application for consideration in terms of heritage legislation. eThembeni Heritage Practitioners exemption from a full Heritage Impact Assessment motivation has been considered .While the general area of proposed development lies in a region where heritage resources are expected, spot checks in observed open areas and along stream lines revealed none. In addition ,although the area is in a moderate paleontological sensitive zone , the Heritage Specialist asserts that weathering of the basement has produced relatively deep soils and the underlying lithology is unlikely to be impacted by the proposed construction activities.

Considering the reasons put forward in support of the development, Amafa has no objection to cultivation of the largely disturbed terrain as outlined in the exemption motivation.

You are also required to adhere to the below-mentioned standard conditions:

Conditions:

- 1. Amafa should be contacted if any heritage objects are identified during earthmoving activities and all development should cease until further notice.
- 2. No structures older than sixty years or parts thereof are allowed to be demolished altered or extended without a permit from Amafa.
- 3. No activities are allowed within 50m of a site, which contains rock art.
- 4. Sources of all natural materials (including topsoil, sands, natural gravels, crushed stone, asphalt, etc.) must be obtained in a sustainable manner and in compliance with the heritage legislation.

Failure to comply with the requirements of the National Heritage Resources Act and the KwaZulu Natal Heritage Resources Act could lead to legal action being instituted against the applicant.
