Van Schalkwyk, J. January 2019. Phase 1 Cultural Heritage Impact Assessment: The Replacement And Upgrade Of Water Reticulation Pipelines Along A Number Of Streets In Alan Manor, Johannesburg South, City Of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality, Gauteng Province

The proposed development entails the replacement and upgrade of water reticulation pipelines along some roads in the Alan Manor suburb of the City of Johannesburg.

The assessment recorded no sites, features or objects of archaeological significance.

The SA Palaeontological Sensitivity Map indicates that most of the study area has Low fossil sensitivity, with a small section of the study area having Moderate fossil sensitivity.

Final Comment

Considering the findings of the specialist report, and that the proposed project entails replacement of pre-existing infrastructure, In terms of archaeological and palaeontological heritage, the SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Unit has no objections to this proposed development, provided that the recommendations in the specialist reports and this comment are adhered to, and on the following conditions:

- If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g., remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments and charcoal/ash concentrations) or palaeontological remains are found during the proposed activities, SAHRA must be alerted immediately, and a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, based on the nature of the finds, must be contacted as soon as possible to inspect the findings. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of significance a Phase 2 rescue operation might be necessary.
