As stated in the SAHRA review comment (09.12.2010), it is requested that:

- An archaeologist will be required to inspect the borrow pit for potential heritage resources before the Environmental Management Plan is finalised. A report on the outcome of this inspection must be sent to SAHRA for further comment.

- A palaeontologist must be present on site during bulk excavation

- If this is not deemed feasible, then the palaeontologist must assure the presence on site of a trained surveyor who is able to identify fossil material.

The EMP must include a clause alerting on the possible presence of fossil and archaeological material on sites and the procedures to follow in case these findings are identified.

If these recommendations are adhered to, the SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Unit has no objection to the development (in terms of the archaeological and palaeontological component of the heritage resources). If any new evidence of archaeological sites or artefacts, palaeontological fossils, graves or other heritage resources are found during development, construction or mining, SAHRA and a professional
