Thank you for notifying Amafa about the development. The heritage practitioner did not find heritage sites or features on the development precinct and the surroundings covering 50m from the proposed pipeline development .

Amafa therefore has no objection to the development as no heritage resources are under threat.

The developer is however required to ensure that the below mentioned standard conditions are adhered to:

Conditions:

1. Amafa should be contacted if any heritage objects/features are identified during earthmoving activities and all development should cease until further notice.
 2. No structures older than sixty years or parts thereof are allowed to be demolished altered or extended without a permit from Amafa.
 3. No activities are allowed within 50m of a site, which contains rock art.
- Sources of all natural materials (including topsoil, sands, natural gravels, crushed stone, asphalt, etc.) must be obtained in a sustainable manner and in compliance with the heritage legislation.
