Final Comment

The proposed development entails expansion of a poultry farm, located on 2ha of land on Portion 348 of Kameeldrift Farm 313, Pretoria West, Gauteng. The business proposes to expand on the existing chicken layer facility, as well as develop a vegetable production facility and goat farm. The chicken layer facility expansion and proposed land for cultivation will encompass 1.06 ha of the 2ha farm. The existing facility currently has 1000 layer chickens, and proposes to expand by erecting new structures with a capacity of 40 000 chicken layers, as well as 0.2 ha of land within the farm for vegetable production.

The archaeological assessment recorded no significant archaeological sites, features or material.

The palaeontological assessment states that both the bedrock and regolith underlying the project area are considered to be unfossiliferous. Accordingly, any negative impacts upon the geology underlying the majority of the proposed project will have nil significance on the palaeontological heritage of the area.

Final Comment

In terms of archaeological and palaeontological heritage, the SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Unit has no objections to this proposed development, provided that the recommendations in the specialist reports and this comment are adhered to, and on the following conditions:

- If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g., remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments and charcoal/ash concentrations) or

palaeontological remains are found during the proposed activities, SAHRA must be alerted immediately, and a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, based on the nature of the finds, must be contacted as soon as possible to inspect the findings. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of significance a Phase 2 rescue operation might be necessary.
