The proposed development entails a residential development, known as Majella Park Residential Development is located on Erf 749 Oakdene Extension 19, Gauteng Province.

The assessment yielded no archaeological heritage resources.

An informal church was recorded and is classified as living heritage. The church is located under a cluster of trees in the western portion of the study area. The author recommends that during the public participation process the congregation must be involved in the process and informed of the proposed development, giving them adequate time to find a suitable replacement site.

Final Comment

Considering that no significant archaeological heritage resources occur within the study area ,and that the SA Palaeontological Sensitivity Map indicates that the study area has Low palaeontological sensitivity (therefore no palaeontological studies are required, however a protocol for finds is required), the SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Unit has no objections to this proposed development on the following conditions:

- If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g., remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments and charcoal/ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed activities, SAHRA must be alerted immediately, and a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must
