The proposed development entails upgrading of the for the proposed PRASA maintenance depots at Wolmerton Depot, City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality. The site covers approximately 64 hectares and a length of 2150 metres.

As there is apparently no evidence of any significant archaeological material in this area, and the study area is not palaeontologically sensitive, the SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Unit has no objection to the development on condition that, if any new evidence of archaeological sites or artefacts, palaeontological fossils, graves or other heritage resources are found during upgrading activities, SAHRA or an archaeologist or palaeontologist must be alerted immediately.
