1. THE FACADE OF THE GEORGIAN KAROO-STYLE DWELLING-HOUSE SITUATED AT 49 MURRAY STREET, GRAAFF-REINET

Description:

The facade of the Georgian Karoo-style dwelling-house situated on the Remainder of Erf 1701, Graaff-Reinet, in the Municipality and Division of Graaff-Reinet.

Deed of Transfer T10100/1983, dated 22 March 1983.

2. THE PROPERTY WITH THE GLEN THORN PRESBYTERIAN SETTLER'S CHURCH AND CEMETERY THEREON, SITUATED ON PORTION 1 OF THE FARM GLEN THORN, DIVISION OF BEDFORD

Description:

The fenced site with the Glen Thorn Presbyterian Settler's Church and adjacent cemetery thereon, situate on a portion of certain piece of abolished quitrent land in the Division of Bedford, being Portion 1 of the farm Glen Thorn 41.

3. THE SITE WITH THE W. D. PRETORIUS DWELLING-HOUSE AND OUTBUILDING THEREON, SITUATED IN CHURCH STREET, POTCHEFSTROOM

Description:

The site together with the W. D. Pretorius dwelling-house and the outbuilding thereon, consisting of 1 675 square metres of land, indicated as figure ABCDEFA on Survey Diagram LG A3686/86, dated 13 June 1986, filed in the office of the Surveyor-General in Pretoria, being a Proclamation Area over Portion 8 of Erf 257, situate in the Town of Potchefstroom, Registration Division IQ, Transvaal.

Certificate of Consolidated Title T32550/1982, dated 10 September 1982.

4. THE OLD POLICE-STATION COMPLEX, SITUATED ON THE TOWNLANDS OF VENTERSBURG

Description:

The site, together with the old Police-station complex thereon, described as follows: The figure ABCD represents 4 969 square metres of land, being a national monument site on a portion of the Remainder of the farm Ventersburg Dorpsgronden 934 (now known as Ventersburg Dorpsgronde 354), situated in the Administrative District of Ventersburg, Province of the Orange Free State, as shown on Surveyor's Diagram LG 761/1986, dated 11 August 1986, and filed in the office of the Surveyor-General in Bloemfontein.
