PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section *eight* of the Natural and Historical, Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act (Act No. 4 of 1934), I hereby proclaim St. Stephen's Church, Cape Town, with 107 square roods 70 square feet and 12 square inches of land (now known as Erf No. 2080, Cape Town) to be a monument.

DESCRIPTION.

St. Stephen's Church, Cape Town.

Certain piece of land, with the buildings thereon, situate in Cape Town at the Boerenplein (now known as Erf No. 2080, Cape Town), measuring 47 feet 4 inches in breadth and 107 feet 4 inches in length together with 30 feet in every direction around the same making a total area of 107 square roods 70 square feet and 12 square inches (diagram filed with Old Cape Freeholds, Volume 5, Folio 44, dated 25th November, 1800).

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

This building was opened as a theatre in 1800 and was taken into use as a church and school in 1839.
