PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section *eight* of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act (Act No. 4 of 1934). I hereby proclaim the Old School. Huntly Street, Grahamstown, to be a monument.

DESCRIPTION.

*Huntly Street School, Grahamstown.*

Certain piece of land including the buildings, being Erf No. 3577, Grahamstown, Province of the Cape of Good Hope, situate in Huntly Street (formerly Dundas Street), Grahamstown, measuring 68 square roods 33 square feet, Deed of Grant No. 9185/1918, dated 14th September, 1918, Diagram No. 429/1841, attached to Deed of Grant Albany Freeholds Vol. 8 Folio 10, dated 11th December, 1843.

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

This building was opened in 1849 as the school of St. George's Church and from then onwards played an important part in education. The first classes of St. Andrew's College were held in it.
