## PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section *eight* of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No.4 of 1934), I hereby proclaim a certain piece of land, including the buildings, attached to the church at Bathurst in the Division of Albany, now known as Erf No. 103, Bathurst, to be a monument.

## DESCRIPTION.

1820 Settler's Church, Bathurst.

Certain piece of land including the buildings, attached to the church at Bathurst in the Division of Albany, now known as Erf No. 103, Bathurst. Measuring 1 morgen, 248 sq. roods and 39  $^{6}/_{25}$ . sq. feet. (Diagram No. 715/1849 as filed with the Deeds Registry Duplicate of Albany Freeholds, Volume 9, Folio 35, dated 19.2.1849).

## HISTORICAL INTEREST.

This fine church was built by 1820 settlers. The foundation stone was laid in 1832. It repeatedly served as a place of refuge and fortification during times of war.
