

2. THE *KLEINE SCHUUR* MANOR-HOUSE, SITUATED ON THE *GROOTE SCHUUR* ESTATE, DISTRICT OF WYNBERG

*Description*

The manor-house known as *Kleine Schuur* with five metres of surrounding land, situated on the farm Westbrooke (now known as the Remainder of Erf 46165, Cape Town at Rondebosch), in the Municipality of Cape Town, Division of the Cape of Good Hope.

Deed of Transfer T17248/1954, dated 21 October 1954.

3. A PORTION OF THE FARM WESTBROOKE WITH THE MANOR-HOUSE KNOWN AS *GROOTE SCHUUR* AND THE OUTBUILDINGS THEREON, AT RONDEBOSCH, CAPE TOWN

*Description*

A portion of the farm Westbrooke (now known as the Remainder of Erf 46165, Cape Town at Rondebosch) with the manor-house known as *Groote Schuur* and the outbuildings thereon, in the Municipality of Cape Town, Division of the Cape of Good Hope, as indicated by the figure Y K A B C D E F G H I J Y on a site plan of the Department of Public Works of existing buildings on the *Groote Schuur* Estate, dated March 1991 and filed on File 9/2/111/72.1 in the office of the National Monuments Council at Cape Town.

4. *WESTBROOKE*, SITUATED ON THE *GROOTE SCHUUR* ESTATE, DISTRICT OF WYNBERG

*Description*

The exterior of the manor-house known as *Westbrooke*, with 5 metres of surrounding land on the western side and 10 metres of land on the northern, eastern and southern sides, respectively, situated on the farm Westbrooke (now known as the Remainder of Erf 46165, Cape Town at Rondebosch), in the Municipality of Cape Town, Division of the Cape of Good Hope.

5. THE HISTORIC BUILDING KNOWN AS *TUYNHUYS*, INCLUDING THE GARDEN ON THE NORTH-WESTERN SIDE AND EXTENDING TO GOVERNMENT AVENUE, SITUATED ON STALPLEIN, CAPE TOWN

*Description*

The historic building known as *Tuynhuys*, including the garden on the north-western side and extending to Government Avenue, situated on a portion of unregistered State land, now known as Erf 95165, Cape Town, in the Municipality of Cape Town.
