

9. THE BUILDING KNOWN AS THE POST HOUSE, SITUATED ON THE REMAINDER OF ERF 171, GREYTON

Description

The building known as the Post House and five metres of land to the southern and western sides of the building, situated on a portion of the Remainder of Erf 171, in the Municipality of Greyton, Division of Caledon.
