PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 8 (1) (a) of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No.4 of 1934), as amended, I hereby proclaim a certain piece of land with the original building thereon known as Pinehurst, situate in the Municipality and Division of Oudtshoorn, to be a monument.

DESCRIPTION.

*Original Building at Pinehurst, Oudtshoorn.*

Certain piece of land with the original building thereon, known as Pinehurst, excluding the later additions completed in 1964, situate in the Municipality and Division of Oudtshoorn, being Lots Nos. 361 to 365 (now Erf No. 734, Oudtshoorn), measuring 11 morgen 162 square roods [Diagram No. 1732/1894, filed with Registration Duplicate of Deed of Transfer No. 6551/1894, dated 17th November, 1894).

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

The original building Pinehurst is one of the so-called ostrich palaces built at the beginning of the present century when the ostrich feather industry reached its peak.
