PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 8 (1) (*a*) of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No.4 of 1934), I, Johannes de Klerk, Minister of National Education, hereby proclaim the De Waal Park, Cape Town, to be a monument.

DESCRIPTION.

De Waal Park, Gardens, an area situate in the City and Municipality of Cape Town, Administrative District of the Cape, Province of the Cape of Good Hope, and measuring 6. 8536 morgen, as shown in Surveyor-General Diagram 5433/67; an unregistered portion of the Property: Certain area of land situate in the immediate environs of the City of Cape Town, being part of the Estate of Oranjezicht (now known as Erf 1227, Oranjezicht) and measuring 12 morgen 190 square roods (Diagram 1218/ 1876).

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

The De Waal Park was laid out through the endeavours of David Christiaan de Waal, M.L.A., Mayor of Cape Town (1889-90) and opened in 1895 as a park for the use of the general public.
