## DECLARATION OF A NATIONAL MONUMENT

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Johannes Petrus van der Spuy, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the following area with the rock paintings thereon, on the farm Kalkoen Kraal, Aliwal North, to be a national monument, viz:-

## Description

A rectangular piece of land, approximately 80 feet long and 30 feet wide, including the cave, known as Cave 1 or the White Lady Cave, with the rock paintings in it, being a portion of the remainder of certain abolished quitrent land know as Kalkoen Kraal (now known as remainder of the farm Kalkoen Kraal 95), situate in the Division of Aliwal North, and measuring, as remainder, 1,085 morgen 541 square roods and held under paragraph 1 of Deed of Transfer 4958/1959, dated 28 April 1959.

## Historical Interest

This cave contains very rare and important rock paintings which can be compared with those in the well-known Brandberg Cave, Brandberg, South-West Africa.
