PROTECTION OF MONUMENTS.

Under section *eight* of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I, HARRY GORDON LAWRENCE, Minister of the Interior, do hereby proclaim the objects set out in the Schedule below to be monuments in terms of paragraph (a) of that section.

SCHEDULE.

IN THE CAPE PROVINCE.

<i>Object.</i>	<i>Situation.</i>
Koopmans de Wet House.	Partly on Lots Nos. 8 and 10, Block I, and Lot No. 10, Block J, 35 Strand Street, Cape Town.
"Rust en Vreugd", Cape Town.	Building known as "Rust en Vreugd" forming part of the Old Normal College Building, Roeland Street, Cape Town.
Old Church Volksmuseum.	Certain piece of freehold land, situate in the Municipality and Division of Tulbagh, being "The Museum" portion of the land held by the Kerkraad of the Dutch Reformed Congregation at Tulbagh under Deed of Grant, dated 15th November, 1851 (Worcester Freeholds, Vol. 6, folio 45), measuring 21 square rods and 18 square feet. Deed of Transfer. No. 7139/1928, dated 18th July, 1928.
Huguenot Museum.	Certain piece of freehold land called "Die Ou Pastorie", situate in the Municipality and Division of Paarl, allotted to P. J. van Maarseveen on the 28th February, 1699 (old Stellenbosch Eiendoms Boekdeel 1 b, No. 459) and finally transferred to the said "Kerkraad" in its capacity aforementioned on the 3rd August, 1937. No. 8040, measuring twenty-eight thousand eight hundred and seventy (28,870) square feet.
