by die eiendom met die Ou Offisiersmenasie daarop,
geleë te Pauletstraat 45, Somerset-Oos, tot nasionale
gedenkwaardigheid.

Beskrywing

Die eiendom met die Ou Offisiersmenasie daarop,
synde 'n sekere stuk grond geleë in die munisipaliteit
en afdeling van Somerset-Oos, synde die restant van
Erf 57, Somerset-Oos, en groot drieduisend seshon-
derd ses-en-twintig (3 626) vierkante meter.

Historiese en argitektoniese belang

Hierdie Georgiëanse dubbelverdiepinggebou is oor-
spronklik om en by 1815 deur lord Charles Somerset
opgerig as menasie vir offisiere en vermoedelik ook
soldate wat aan die Oosgrens gestasioneer was. Die
Victoriaanse veranda is later aangebring. 10/2/833.

DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH THE
OLD OFFICERS' MESS THEREON, AT 45 PAU-
LET STREET, SOMERSET EAST

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10
(1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of
1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of Natio-
nal Education, hereby declare the property with the
Old Officers' Mess thereon, situated at 45 Paulet
Street, Somerset East, to be a national monument.

Description

The property with the Old Officers' Mess thereon,
being certain piece of land situate in the Municipality
and Division of Somerset East, being the remainder
of Erf 57, Somerset East, and measuring three thou-
sand six hundred and twenty-six (3 626) square
metres.

Deed of Transfer 29920/1974, dated 5 September
1974.

Historical and architectural interest

This Georgian double-storeyed building was origi-
nally erected in about 1815 by Lord Charles Somer-
set for officers and presumably also soldiers who were
stationed on the Eastern Frontier. The Victorian
verandah was added later. 10/2/833.
