PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section *eight* of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, (Act No. 4 of 1934), as amended, I hereby proclaim to be a monument the church and school buildings and premises, Cuylerville, District of Bathurst.

DESCRIPTION.

The church, school and premises: The figure A B C D represents Portion 1 (Cuylerville Church) of the farm Allotment Henry Vokins, situate in the Division of Bathurst, Province of the Cape of Good Hope, as shown on Diagram No. 9933/60, dated 19th January, 1961.

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

A party of 256 settlers under Lieut. John Baillie R.N. established themselves here in 1820 and named the place Cuylerville. On this site they built a church and school, which also served as a fortification against the repeated attacks of the Xhosas. The present building was erected in 1840.
